Our mission is to build community agency on good governance, gender equality, human rights, and peace-building for social change

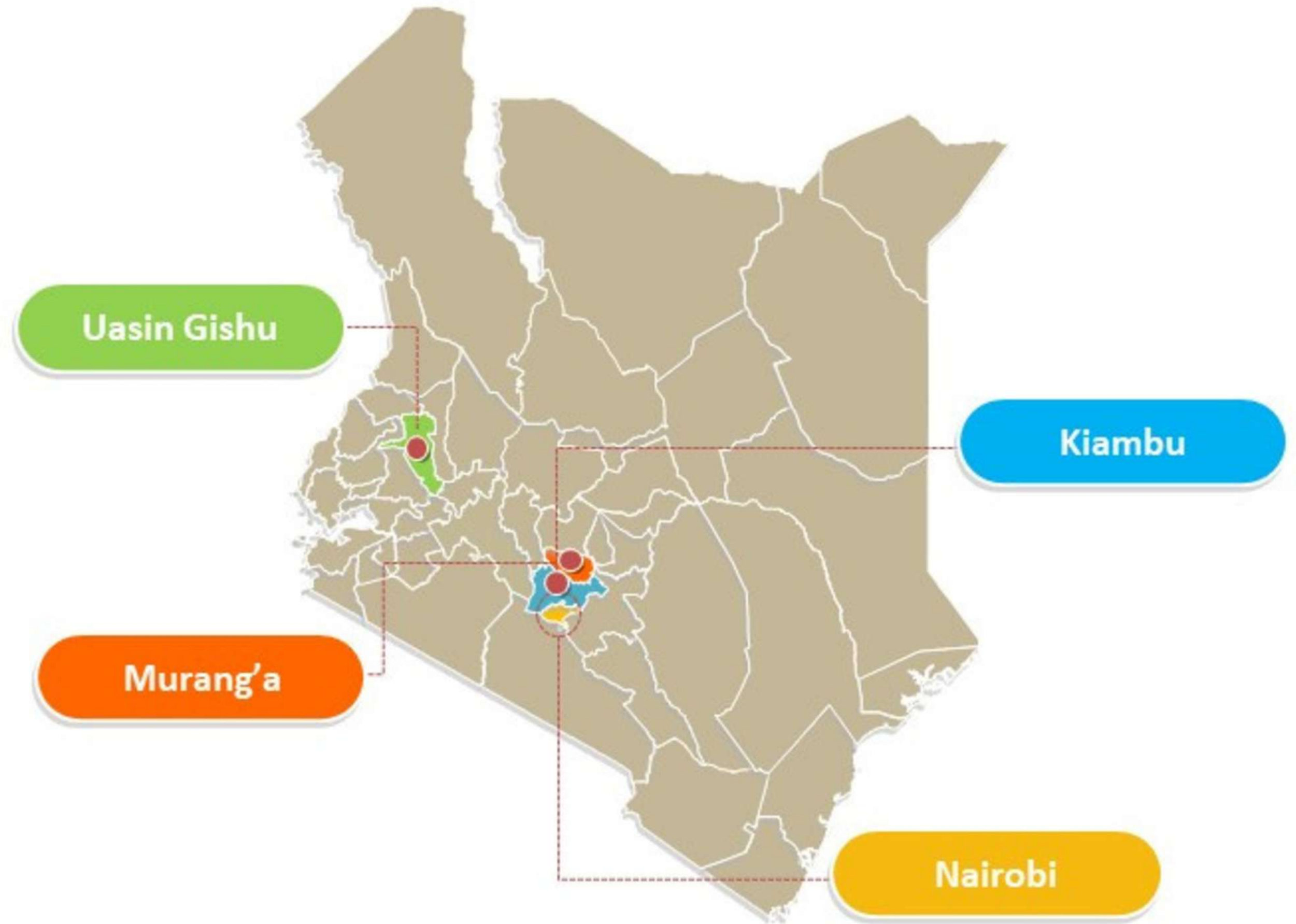

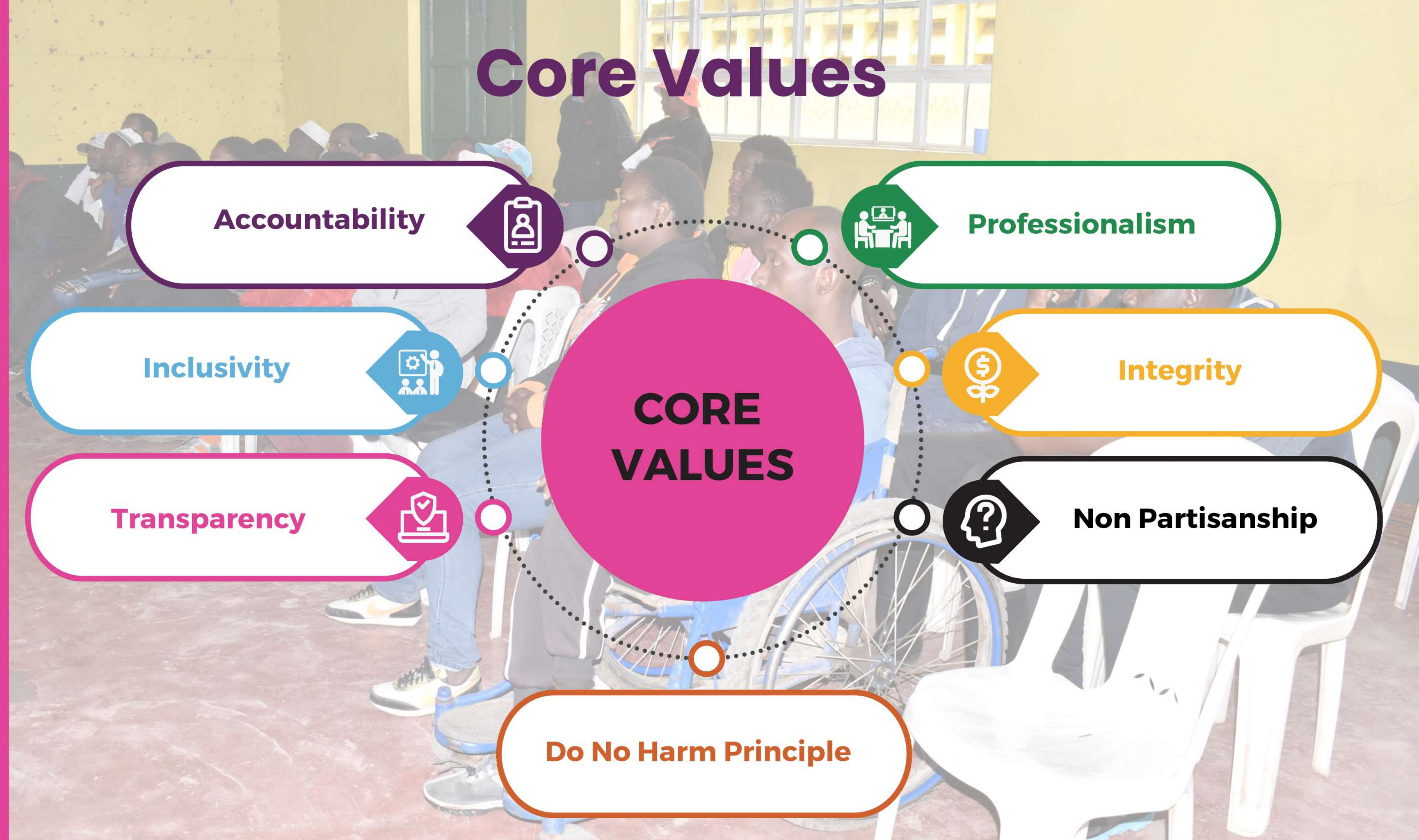

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# Programs/ Pillars

CEEC's operational framework is structured around four pillars: **Good Governance, Gender Equality, Human Rights, and Peace Building**. These pillars reflect a comprehensive and multi-dimensional approach to addressing challenges in CEEC's geographical areas of operation. In addition, CEEC acknowledges the interdependence of key factors that contribute to sustainable development and social change.



## GOOD GOVERNANCE

This program aims at promoting civic engagement and inclusive participation of all members of the society, especially women and youth in governance, leadership and decision making at all levels.

## GENDER EQUALITY

This program aims at enhancing the capacity of communities to understand and address discriminative gender norms, and entrenched gender stereotypes.

## HUMAN RIGHTS

This program aims at building the capacity of communities as right holders in the target counties to claim and defend their rights and access justice.

## PEACE BUILDING

This program seeks to enhance communities' capacity to effectively participate in peace processes, and equip them with positive conflict resolution and transformation skills, thus promoting harmonious co-existence.
